The other is the Kumano Kodo, a journey through a thousand years of Buddhist history on Japan's beautiful Kii Peninsula that connects these iconic sites. The Shikoku Pilgrimage (???? Shikoku Henro) or Shikoku Junrei (????) is a multi-site pilgrimage of 88 temples associated with the Buddhist monk Kukai (Kobo Daishi) on the island of Shikoku, Japan.
